11. Proposed Changes to the Constitution Section 7 FINANCE

Para

iii) The internal Accounting System of the Club shall be as agreed with the Honorary Auditors and be such that all monies held in connection with major projects such as Rallies, Equipment and other special activities as directed by the Committee shall be identifiable.

Add

(a) Profits derived from nominated voluntary fund raising activities shall be split equally between club funds and a nominated registered charity or charities. Such charity or charities shall be formally voted upon and agreed by the club membership prior to such fund raising activities.

A discussion took place about the definition and merits of the proposed wording A summary below.

Dodge 2E0GPZ was concerned that not all good causes were registered Charities.

Words 'Charitable' or 'good cause' suggested by G0TZZ

Stuart G7KBF also voiced concerns regarding the word 'Registered'

Tony G0MQG suggested the plural 'Charities' with 'registered' removed

M0IMW said 'Good Cause or Causes'

Tony M0SWO briefly defined the words 'Charity' and 'Registered' and said that he would provide more detail.

GOCLR brought up the financial assurances by using 'Registered Charities'

Peter M0VRA Nominated 'worthy cause or causes'

G0TZZ proposed that all funds should go to the charity, not 50/50 split with club.

Richard suggested the split should be voted for by club members based on the charity concerned

Tracy "2E0CEY said remove 'Registered' to leave 'charitable causes'

G3YLA asked for Tony M0SWO to suggest the wording which he considered correct.

G7URP asked for the members to ratify the wording change in principle so that we could not have to wait until next AGM to approve.

Proposed Motions

G0TZZ prefer all funds should go to the charity not 50/50

G7URP suggested a proportion of the money to Charity

GOCLR suggested an EGM to ratify the revised wording

G3XLG suggested to take out the words "equally" and "registered" which would suffice.
