But as I started to do it for 2018 I realised how different the last year has been, mainly because of the opportunities which Skype has now opened up for us. For no longer are we limited only to guests prepared to come to Norwich, but now we can experience talks from almost anyone anywhere in the world. Already we have had live presentations from as far afield as Canada, Turkey, the United States and, erm, Bournemouth!

When Roger first asked me if I thought we could make Skype work acceptably with a large audience, at first, I just said "yes of course".

It was only after I thought about the potential problems of having a PA system for the room, and then potential feedback from sending our audio back to the guest as well as hearing him or her at the same time, that I realised it may not be as simple as I first thought! However, I am really pleased we pursued the challenge - after all that's what our hobby is all about - experimentation with communication! And thanks to lots of experiments, along with some neat anti-noise software and clever tech in the video mixer we seem to carry it off

And at this point, as well as thanking Roger for coming up with the original idea and booking so many interesting guests, I would really like to thank the team that help bring the Skype to talk to you, because technically it's quite difficult to do well, and although it's mostly my equipment that wouldn't work on its own, so special thanks to Kevin, Robert, Mike and Tammy for their great work on these live links.

As I mentioned a moment ago, one of the main objectives of our hobby, according to Ofcom, is to encourage experimentation with technology, and so as well as our talks and regular events I'm really pleased that last year the club started its own electronics group – Electron.

It's still early days of course, but with our online IO group and over 20 members attending each Electron get together I think it is a strong base from which to grow and become a regular and important part of the club.

However, I really don't want it to rely just on me, so please feel completely free to suggest ideas, or better still run a session and share something electronic which you really enjoy. Electron was actually one of the projects born out of members sharing ideas and suggestions in our annual Forum. And this year's Forum happens to be here next Wednesday, so please be thinking of talks you would like, places you would like to visit and other things you would like the club to do for you.
