Minutes of NARC Forum held on Wednesday 17th April 2019

Members Forum Attendees 47 + 12 Committee

Opening of meeting

David G7URP opened the meeting with the usual club notices before inviting questions or suggestions from the floor. David set a finish time of 21.00 for the questions, with an absolute finish at 21.15.

He also stressed that it wasn't just up the committee to decide and plan events etc, but should be guided by the members as to what is wanted in the way of talks, visits and other activities within the club. David then asked for comments on the previous year's events. The general option was that the mix of activities & events were more than satisfactory to most of the people most of the time. The Chairman asked that if the effort was made to put on an SES or visits that the members should make the effort to help or attend, as lack of support would result in these type of activities being cancelled in the future.

Major suggestions discussed were:

To give some order to proceedings, the forum addressed the three main activities within NARC.

Talks:

Steve M7EVA worried that members could not compete with external speakers and hence not able to win the Talk of the year, he suggested that we have a member and external category.

Tony G0MQG suggested that it would have no bearing on who offered to do a talk. Donard and Peter agreed that it wouldn't make a difference.

David G7URP mentioned he had to use Radio Active day presentations to have a list rather than the three that were local members talks, to pad out the list.

Peter M0VRA suggested a certificate for external speakers, which could be emailed to save the cost of shipping the trophy.

Phil G6AIO suggested an emailed certificate for best external speaker

Malcolm G3PDH saw the benefit of both internal and external awards and all agreed.

M0ZAE All speakers deserve some recognition as there is a lot of work preparing one.

David G7URP explained the committee thoughts and the decision on the proposal.

Jim G3YLA suggested that the limited number of internal speakers prepared to speak was making it awkward awarding the Trophy to the same people each year. He suggested a scheme to help decide on awards by awarding NARC points at all events and at the end of the year an award for the highest number. Tony M0MQG thought and several agreed not many would do it.

Donard thought it a good idea but, suggested short 20minute chats on things that they are doing in the hobby in an impromptu type scene. He offered help to any that need itwith planning and preparing a talk. David G7URP has addressed this reluctance to speak publicly in a positive way and will be doing a Q&A interview with Tony G0MQG in a future evening.

Malcolm G3PDH thought it worth stressing that not that many voted this last year for the speaker of the year, he expected more votes for the next year. A proper voting form was available so there should be no excuse for not voting in any year.

Sonny M0SYW suggested that not all talks need to be Power point slide show it could involve practical demonstrations with live close up video to ensure everyone can see.

Roger G3LDI - Offered a full program for the whole of 2019 and asked for suggestions for new talks for the future, 2020 onwards. He said he wanted more radio related and personally he didn't like the 'my other hobby is' type presentations. He asked whether we wanted more quality skype type talks, Tony wanted more local member talks. But understood there were other reasons.(lack of volunteer member speakers) Donard suggested the current mix of skype, local and informal was a good mix and that we had had some excellent evenings.

Paul G3VPT liked non radio related offering Paul Moneys as an example..

Phil G4LPP offered to put something together, he also suggested a suggestion board that would be available for people to ask for topics of interest, NARC could then find a speaker

Steve G4GHO wanted a talk on smart metering and offered to assist A.N. other to do it....only if some could step forward to help.

Rod G0CBO wanted a talk on Listening/SWL but more of outside the ham bands. Ideas on what VHF UHF antennas for general coverage along with HF wires.

lan G4JQT construction Winner, worked for BT monitoring and offered to do it, Tony G0MQG offered to assist.
